Our Digital Learning Plan

1. Introduction

This document records the outcomes of the current digital learning plan, including targets and the actions we will implement to meet the targets.

1.1 School Details:

Scoil Mhuire Secondary School, Trim, is an all-girls school of 818 students 60 teachers and two Inclusion Support Assistants. It offers the Junior Certificate, Leaving Certificate, Transition Year, Leaving Certificate Applied and Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme. The school's enrolment has increased significantly in recent years. Student enrolment has now peaked.

Students use the available technology (consisting of two computer rooms and two student device trolleys) in the classrooms on a timetabled basis (timetable located on Microsoft Teams).

1.2 School Vision:

- Scoil Mhuire's vision is to formulate a digital learning plan to enable staff and students to become digitally literate. We want our community of learners to be able to access digital technology in an ethical and responsible manner, to collaborate, share expertise and knowledge, to continue to strive for excellence in our learning, teaching and assessment.
- Scoil Mhuire will continue to build on what has already been put in place. This includes the introduction of tablet devices to the vast majority of the teaching staff (except for those who opt out).
- It is envisioned that digital technologies will enhance student engagement to become independent and active learners.
- Teachers will support this through the sharing of effective pedagogical approaches and the sharing of knowledge.
- The Leadership and Management team will support infrastructural changes and promote CPD opportunities (both in & out of school).



1.3 Brief account of the use of digital technologies in the school to date:

- During the academic year 2017/2018, Scoil Muire introduced a Digital Leaders Team comprising 15 teachers who continue to be trained in Digital Leadership by Wriggle. A 'buddy system' was set up between these Digital Leaders and the 18 teachers who received a tablet in Cycle 2 of the rollout during the academic year 2018/2019.
- All classrooms have been fitted with Screen Beams, used to mirror teacher tablet devices.
- ICT Coordinators provided training for all staff in the use of Microsoft OneDrive.
- The new updated School Website is used to communicate school news and updates to the wider community.
- All First year, Transition year, Fifth year and Sixth year students have timetabled Information Technology classes.
- Staff collaborate with each other through Microsoft Office (Teams and Outlook)
- Scoil Muire has 45 student devices stored in two trolleys. These are used to assist Teaching and Learning in the classroom setting.

2. The focus of this Digital Learning Plan

We are currently undertaking a digital learning evaluation in our school during the period (*Sept/2019*) to (*May/2020*). We evaluated our progress using the following sources of evidence:

- Teachers Questionnaires
- Student Focus Groups
- Formal discussions at staff meetings

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EVALUATION PROCEDURES:

(How are we progressing? Do we need to make adjustments? Have we achieved our targets?)

- Time was provided for staff training and it was received positively from those who attended.
- Digital Technology use and confidence amongst staff increased through the creation of a buddy system and Subject Department use of Microsoft Teams.
- Increased uptake on the use of tablets as per the tablet booking system in Teams.
- Mirroring of devices did not happen in 2018/2019 (only in Rm 12 & 16). Device mirroring will happen in 2019/2020 according to Scoil Mhuire IT Department.
- 2019/2020 DL Team need to conduct focus groups.
